

LeRoy E. Hoffberger School of Painting, MFA 2023-24

Total Credits Required: 60 Credits Minimum

MFA students must complete 48 credits of Core Seminar and 12 liberal arts credits or four (3 credit) liberal arts courses to graduate. Students typically pace liberal arts courses - one per semester of study. However, some students "double up" or enroll in (2) two courses in their first and second semesters to dedicate additional time to studio in their 2nd year. Students register for 15 credits total per semester to reach 60 credits.

Maximizing your Academic Opportunities

Students may take up to 19.5 credits per semester to enhance their academic experience beyond the 60 credits required in the MFA degree plan. It's important to be mindful of your studio time as well as Graduate Teaching Internships (GTIs) during the week when building your schedule. Your program director is a great resource to discuss both time management and electives that complement your practice.

D. OPTIONAL: CERTIFICATE IN COLLEGE TEACHING OF ART

- MFA students can earn a Certificate in College Teaching of Art by the successful completion of three GTIs and the graduate course ED 5533 Philosophy and Pedagogy of Post-Secondary Education.
- A graduate student in the role of GTI works in an undergraduate course under the supervision of a faculty member.
 GTIs are expected to be present for every class meeting, and to collaborate with the mentoring instructor, working no more than an average of 6 (six) hours per week.

CHOOSING ELECTIVE COURSEWORK

Recommended Graduate Electives

Review the Schedule of Courses for a complete list of graduate studio, liberal art and professional development elective courses. Students can also choose from dozens of elective courses, graduate or undergraduate, listed in the full schedule of classes on the MICA website.

Baltimore Student Exchange Program

Explore elective courses at our partner institutions (Johns Hopkins University and University of Baltimore) through the Baltimore Student Exchange Program. Forms and approval required through Enrollment Services. Contact the BSEP Coordinator in the Office of Enrollment Services with questions / approval.

Independent Study

Independent study courses provide students the opportunity to develop and conduct self-designed research projects in collaboration with campus faculty. Independent study courses require the instructor approval, and a completed contract complying with MICA standards. Forms should be returned to the Office of Enrollment Services.

Internship for Credit

Professional internships may also be substituted for studio / liberal arts elective credit with permission from your program director. Students must attend an Internship Orientation through the Office of Career Development. Visit MICA's Career Development Office online for more information.

Enrolling in Elective Courses

Graduate students can register for graduate - level courses via MICA's online enrollment system. To register for an undergraduate level course, with prerequisites or enrollment restrictions, you will need to request approval through your graduate advisor.
