## BUSTER

USING A COLLECTION OF 2 BY 4'S OF TWO LENGTHS, 7 DANCERS RESPECTFULLY COMMEMORATE BUSTER KEATON AND HIS ANTICS, CAPTURING HIS MACIGAL CAPACITY TO ESCAPE, SURPRISE, AND AVOID THAT WHACK, THUMP, OR CRASH IN THE HEAD EVENTON IS SO APT TO EXPECT. DANCERS WIELD AN UNGAINLY BEAN THAT THE OTHERS DUCK AND DODGE, ALSO KNOWN AS S'LABSTRICK OR TRICK, BUSTER PREMIERED IN 2002.








Throught the action event, dancers perform STREB's signature pratt falls, crashing into the mat on both their front and back before returning to their feet and doing it all over again. Some areas of the mat receive more impact traffic than others.


The doncers in AIR have their own distinct track to complete throughout the dance – no two are alike. Over the 7 minutes and 15 seconds of the performance, you can see clusters of EXTREME movement, the rapid execution of the various events.




# 8 DANCERS 1 LARGE TRAMPOLINE 2 MINI TRAMPOLINES 4 CRASH MATS

The dance features 8 dancers, 1 large trampoline, 2 mini trampolines, and 4 crash mats.


#### **PATHWAYS**

Some dancers have concentrated movements on one side of the stage. Others find themselves dashing from left to right.











